


NI Maths Role Models

What does your job entail?

Within my role I support the NI banks with the management and oversight of Events and Issues. I provide day to day risk management support to the NI Business and Consumer teams to effectively implement risk management tools and processes to allow them to make commercial decisions having fully considered the risks. In short, I try and help people make good choices and decisions to prevent future problems.

How did you get into this line of work?

Upon joining the bank I was offered a great opportunity to complete my banking exams with the Institute of Bankers in UCD. Whilst completing my exams I worked closely with various different departments and levels of the organisation to gain experience in many different fields. This put me in the best possible position to enable me to progress and move forward in my career with BOI.

Outline your career to date?

I started in Bank of Ireland in 2014 at the age of 21 and performed numerous roles ranging from Cashier, Customer Service Consultant, Business Manager Assistant, Business Advisor and currently, Events & Issues Risk Manager.
