Introduce yourself. Where do you work? What is your job role?

My name is Andrew Burns. I work in Bassett's sales office in Portadown. My job role is Commercial Sales and Pricing.

What does your job entail?

Everything from quoting commercial heating materials and plants, such as gas boilers, pumps, and new renewable technology like air source heat pumps and smart heating controls from the tender stage to various customers. Placing orders for the items for customers who win the tendered jobs and looking after accounts and taking orders for their day-to-day materials.

How did you get into this line of work?

I knew soon after starting my apprenticeship that I didn't want to do it forever, but I still wanted to stay in the plumbing industry. I got a job at Bassett's trade counter in Portadown where I worked for about four years before changing to my current role.

I have five GCSEs at grades A-C and my Level 3 NVQ in Plumbing & Mechanical Services.

What qualities are required for your job – personal and professional?

I have good knowledge of commercial plumbing and heating, as well as good people skills to deal with different customers and suppliers.

Don't be afraid of change. I nearly didn't take the job at Bassett's when I was 22 because I wasn't sure where it would lead, but it turned out to be the best career move I ever made.
