





- Other e.g. dispensary, ward CD checks, interviewing, extended hours.



Hospital Pharmacist Roles — Meet the Team







Rubbing right wrist with left hand and vice versa.




Rotational rubbing with clasped fingers of right hand and vice versa.



Rotational rubbing of left thumb clasped in right hand and vice versa.




Back of fingers to opposing palm with fingers interlocked.






Medicines Governance:

- Medication safety newsletters.










Management:
